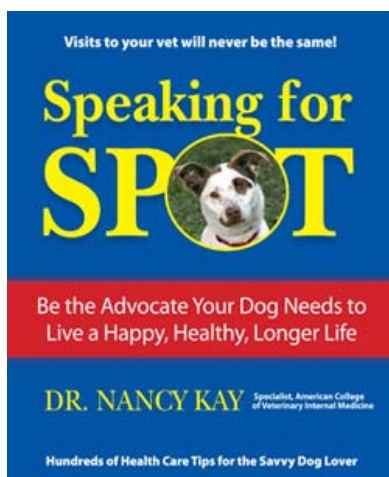
Each organization has specific application criteria. Please check the organization's website first before calling.
